1. Principal's Update:

The school year progressing well although extremely busy. Topher noted ongoing challenge with space and anticipates that the new portable (expected January 2018) will help alleviate this concern.

2. Don Evans, Executive Director for Our Place Society

Don provided overview of the Yates Street Shelter, expected to reopen Nov 28 – Dec 1, in the Boys and Girls Club on Yates Street (owned by City of Victoria – CoV). His presentation at the evening's meeting was a part of Our Place Society's public consultation process. Don reviewed the following aspects of their proposal:

- Our Place provides services to people living in poverty from all walks of life.
- They provide 1600 meals/day and run 60 programs on health care, employment and education.
- Stemming from Victoria's Tent City issue, the Yates Street Shelter originally ran successfully for 18 months, closing in July 2017. During that time they housed upwards of 70 residents and developed great relationships with surrounding community and Central Middle School.
- If approved, there will be notable differences in the reopening of the Shelter including:
 - There will be a lower incidence of mental health and substance use issues as the 40 residents have already stabilized through their stay in the First Metropolitan Church.
 - There will be no tents set up inside the Shelter (they contribute to sense of isolation) and instead residents' space will be delineated by dividers.
 - Security for the neighbourhood will be onsite 24/7.
 - Residents will be put in charge of cleaning up surrounding area.
