### 1. Welcome

#### 2. CISV Victoria Presentation

Gemma and Orion (CMS students) attended the meeting to fill us in on their summer activities with Children's International Summer Villages (CISV). They attended a camp in Toronto with participants and staff from around the world. The goal of CISV is to foster a globally inclusive attitude in young people and to provide them with positive leadership experiences and opportunities both locally and globally. There is an info night for interested families on September 28<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at 7pm at St. Aidan's Hall.

# 3. Principal/Vice Principal's Report

a. First day of school

Unfortunately, the Esquimalt dancers had to cancel last minute, so the teachers and staff stepped up to perform with traditional drums.

b. Meet the teachers night – Thursday, Sept 13<sup>th</sup> 6-7pm

PAC table from 5:30-6:15pm to increase PAC presence. At 6:15 there is an assembly for parents.

c. Indigenous Families and Friends Night – Thursday, Sept 20<sup>th</sup> 6pm in the cafeteria Looking for some PAC funding and involvement. Ray will be talking about programming and indigenous education at CMS. Chinese food and pizza will be on the menu. Good opportunity to increase engagement with indigenous families and the PAC.

## d. Enrolment update

Currently at 599 students, expecting to stabilize at 601 students in 24 divisions. Enrolment has been full since July, so unfortunately some new local families were turned away and sent to Monterey. As spaces open at CMS, these families are being contacted. Classes this year are following government guidelines for smaller class sizes. Strong staff at CMS this year, including new additions.

If parents would like their child to carry a cell phone for travel safety/logistics to and from school, this must be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the administration. If approved, the child may bring their phone to school and MUST check the phone in at the office first thing in the morning. Even in such cases, the phone must not be used on school property. This might be a good opportunity for indigenous engagement as Victoria is home to many indigenous artists!

### g. Christmas Hampers

Last year, the PAC completed approximately 20 hampers for needy families with CMS students. The PAC asks the school councillors for advise on families that may need a hamper. The councillors provide an anonymous list of families with ages and genders so that the PAC can compile hampers with suitable products. Once completed, the school councillors deliver the hampers to the families in need. This initiative was previously spearheaded by a PAC parent who's child has moved to high school so a new team of parents is needed this year. We had a volunteer on the first day of school, as well as Amaiah and Dee at tonight's meeting. Thank you!
